## Tonight's Matchup:

The Cougars return only three players, none of which averaged more than two points per game last season. ### Rincon 59 Marcos 57

The key match up here was of power forwards Gilbert Tafoya and Ryan Bawek. Both came into the game leading their respective teams in scoring. While the Rangers did not completely shut down Bawek, they did contain him to 14 points. On the other side of the ball. Marcos De Niza had no answer for Tafoya down low. He dropped a game high 29 points on 13 of 19 shooting, while adding nine boards. Timely outside shooting by Travis Timmons, Andrew Martinez, and (shooting bull) Jesse Henry helped elevate Rincon over the visiting Padres. The trio combined to go 5-9 from beyond the three-point arc. However, the Rangers totaled a dismal 4-13 from the line. Had they shot at their season average, the game wouldn't have been as close.

#### Rincon 61 Foothills 54

On a Friday night up in the Foothills, one would expect the Falcon Faithful to show up in droves. However, the Rincon fans spent the night embarrassing Cat Foot in their house. The group of rowdy Ranger students (46 counted at one time) stood and cheered the entire game, outdoing the home Foothills' fans. On the floor, Rincon started out sluggishly, but pulled things together in the second half to get their first road win of the season. Gilbert Tafoya recorded yet another double double, with 17 points and 13 rebounds. The rest of the scoring was well spread as Andrew Martinez, Rob Perry, Jesse Henry and Nate Foster each had between 9 and 13 points. Martinez and Henry also combined for 9 of the Ranger's 14 steals.
