Tonight's Matchup:

The Rangers find themselves in a difficult situation. At 6-5 in power point games, they are currently 26th in power points with only 24 making the state tournament. Unfortunately, Rincon has only one game remaining against a higher-ranked opponent (Mountain View), which would boost their ranking based on strength of schedule. Instead, the Rangers must post an excellent record in their last seven games to stand a chance of moving on to the postseason. Tucson High is the only foe they face twice. The Badgers have posted some impressive wins (Cienega, Mountain View) and some poor losses (Sabino, Ironwood Ridge). The Badgers have dropped their last three games and are now on the road for 8 of their last 9 games.

Nogales 70 Rincon 60

Following hotly contested matches earlier in the week against Cienega and Desert View, Rincon found itself in another one Friday night. The visiting apaches won the first two quarters barely, led by Andres Marquez, who's 30 points led all scorers. Rincon's Asha Esprit kept the Rangers close, scoring 29 by the end of the night. The Rangers came out blazing in the third quarter and took a 7-point lead heading into the fourth quarter and kept that lead until the last four minutes. Nogales then went on an 11-2 run capped by a three pointer with 40 seconds remaining. Esprit scored again to tie the game and send it to overtime. Kevionte Alexander scored the first bucket but Nogales then went on another run and finally stretched the lead with six straight free throws.
