## Tonight's Matchup:

Beginning tonight, four of the Rangers last five games will be against teams that are eliminated from playoff contention. Much like Rincon, Rio Rico has been strong against the bottom dwellers of the section but has struggled against the top teams. Those teams are Sahuaro, Sunnyside, and Buena, who have cemented themselves in the first through third spots. Cienega appears to have the best shot to grab the fourth spot and make sectionals, but Sabino and Amphi are currently in position to receive a wild card bid to the state tournament. The Rangers will travel to Pueblo, Douglas, and Catalina (three winnable games) in the next week and will have one more chance for a marquee win as they host Sahuaro next Wednesday on senior night.

## Sunnyside 67 Rincon 47

Last Friday night, the Rangers hosted one of the top teams in the section. Sunnyside currently sits in second place, trailing only Sahuaro and they showed why. The Blue Devils balanced attack kept the Rangers on their heels with a mix of drives to the rim and three-pointers. Senior Adrian Lopez scored 18 and sophomores Carlos Lozoya, Jacob Inclan, and Cesar Ozuna added 17, 13, and 9 with freshman Santino Duarte scoring 7. Rincon struggled after the loss of Jesus Nunez to an ankle injury early in the game. Junior Jordan Murillo continues to perform, scoring 18 points on 8-11 shooting from the floor and grabbing 9 rebounds. Austin Guerrero and Juan Figueroa chipped in 9 and 8 respectively.
