Tonight's Matchup:

Rincon welcomes TUSD rival Pueblo this evening in a non-region matchup that will feature some of the best guard play in town. The Warriors are led by four-year starting point guard Robert Taylor who is lightning quick with his handles and strong enough to finish in traffic. The Ranger defense has been solid at times this season, but they will need to have a 32-minute effort in order to keep Pueblo contained. On the other side of the ball, Rincon needs some easy buckets in transition like they got in the first half against Douglas.

Varsity: Rincon/University 66 Douglas 55

Kevin Brazzle had a huge night to help Rincon win their first game of the regular season over the visiting Bulldogs. In addition to his breakaway dunk, Brazzle hit 3 three-pointers and went 4-6 from the line on his way to 25 points and 7 rebounds. Japhon Harrison had an impressive line as well getting his 19 points on 8-13 shooting from the field. Harrison also pulled down 14 boards to get his double-double and added 5 assists and 3 steals for good measure. Tony Brunenkant chipped in 8 with 6 rebounds and 4 assists.

Junior Varsity: Rincon/University 87 Douglas 41

The JV squad moved to 1-0 on Tuesday with a dominant performance including 9 makes from behind the three-point line. Diondre Andres scored all 18 of his points in the first half and finished with 7 rebounds, 7 assists, and 6 steals. Alan Salazar and Thomas Campbell also got into double-figures, each hitting 3 three-pointers. Freshmen Dorion Shay added 9 points and 7 rebounds in his first night as a Ranger.

Freshmen: Rincon/University 79 Douglas 35

The Rangers freshmen team opened up their home careers with a balanced offensive attack that saw seven players score 8 or more. Rene Felix led the way with 13 points while Elliot Chubon filled the statline with 10 points, 7 assists, and 4 steals. Rincon assisted on over half of its baskets (19 of 33) and totalled more steals (16) than turnovers (11). Eddie Valenzuela led in rebounds with 6 to go with his 12 points.
